

# ENGLISH, ASSOCIATE IN ARTS FOR TRANSFER

The Associate in Arts in English for Transfer degree (AA-T in English) program is designed to give students a broad background in the study and practice of the literary arts and expository writing. The combination of the core courses and the wide variety of electives offered within the degree program prepares students to transfer into the CSU system to pursue a baccalaureate degree in English or similar major with university-level work in areas such as literature, creative writing, and composition as well as in a number of other fields including education, human communication, law, liberal arts, media studies, politics, and other paths of study that lead to careers in which clear communication and critical analysis are essential. Students must complete the Associate Degree for Transfer requirements to earn the AA-T degree.

## Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the program, students will be able to:

- Apply effective rhetorical strategies in relation to audience and purpose in academic and/or creative writing.
- Recognize and differentiate the major literary genres.
- Apply critical reading, thinking, and writing skills to analyze diverse texts within various contexts.
