

# FIELD TRAINING - FIREFIGHTER TRAINEE, NONCREDIT CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION

This certificate is a two-course, noncredit, variable-hour field training program that introduces agency new recruit/employees to the hands-on job requirements of a firefighter. The program provides education and training for a California firefighter trainee including current practices in fire and life safety, basic medical, and rescue techniques.

## Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the program, students will be able to:

- Accurately analyze, appraise and evaluate fire and emergency incidents.
- Identify components of emergency management and firefighter safety including: size-up, report on conditions, the Incident Command System, RECEO, the 10 Standard Firefighting Orders, the 18 Situations that shout "Watch Out", the 16 Firefighter Life Safety Initiatives and the common factors associated with injuries and line of duty deaths.
