## HISTORY, ASSOCIATE IN ARTS FOR TRANSFER

The History Department offers the Associate in Arts in History for Transfer (AA-T in History) degree to introduce students to the widely ranging historical record of human experience. The chronological, geographical, and topical range of courses offers students a variety of choices to transfer into the CSU system to work toward a baccalaureate degree in history or to give a historical dimension to their studies in other disciplines. Students must complete the Associate Degree for Transfer requirements to earn the AA-T degree.
