## HISTORY, ASSOCIATE IN ARTS FOR TRANSFER

The History Department offers the Associate in Arts in History for Transfer (AA-T in History) degree to introduce students to the widely ranging historical record of human experience. The chronological, geographical, and topical range of courses offers students a variety of choices to transfer into the CSU system to work toward a baccalaureate degree in history or to give a historical dimension to their studies in other disciplines. Students must complete the Associate Degree for Transfer requirements to earn the AA-T degree.

## Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the program, students will be able to:

- Read and analyze primary and secondary sources.
- Write college-level analytical essays on historical subjects.
- Describe the basic chronological history of the U.S., Europe, and elective non-European regions chosen by the student.
- Use race, class, and gender as categories of analysis to understand history.
